AHCC REGIONAL

POINT AWARD CLASSIFICATION

On all questions concerning the point system and Year End Awards, the ruling of the Points Committee shall be final.

1. MEMBERSHIP

- A. Owner or lessee, rider, and handler of horse must be a current AHA affiliated member of AHCC in good standing. Owner or lessee of horses may not collect a Year End Award (YEA) if, at the time of the Awards presentation, the owner or lessee is more than 30 days past due on any money or debts owed to AHCC.
- B. Horse must be nominated and a copy of registration papers submitted to the AHCC Points Chairperson and nomination fee paid. Points will accrue on the date of payment and for the remainder of the calendar year.
- C. Points accumulated by a horse during a show season will be transferred to a new owner provided requirement **1. a.** is met.

2. SHOWS

- A. All AHA approved shows within Region 16, AHA Shows outside Region 16 will count under miscellaneous **Outside Of Region 16 Division**. National Points do not count toward Year end awards, but are awarded a special recognition award.

3. POINT VALUES

- A. Classes will count the following points:

1 st	2 nd	3 rd	4 th	5 th	6 th

- B. In Championship or Stake Classes

1st	2nd	3rd	4th	5th	6th
20	12	8	4	2	1

- C. Division Championship based on cumulative points within a division will **not** count, since the horse is not being rejudged (i.e. High Point of the Day).
- D. Horses must be shown in a least two (2) approved shows in their division for performance and/or halter awards. If you ride in a class but do not pin, include on points form with zero (0) for place to fulfill two (2) show requirements.
- E. All points accumulated must be submitted to the Points Chairperson within thirty (30) days of the last day of the horse show. This is the responsibility of the owner or rider.
- F. Schooling Shows do not to count toward any AHCC Regular or Regional YEA

LATE POINTS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

4. REGIONAL YEAR END AWARDS (YEA):

- A. Each division will be awarded Championship through sixth (6th) place. The overall high point awards will be awarded through sixth (6th) place

5. POINTS AND CLASS DISBURSEMENT (PUREBRED, HALF ARABIAN)

- A. These classes will never count for points: Pairs, Family, Sit-A-Buck, and Futurity.
- B. **HIGH POINTS AWARDS:** All approved halter and performance classes to count. Classes not to count are Equitation, Fitting and Showmanship, Horsemanship, etc., where the rider is being judged rather than the horse.
- C. **EQUITATION:** The rider must be under 18 and an AHCC member in good standing. For horse show purposes, the age of an individual on December 1st shall be maintained throughout the year. Persons born on December 1st shall assume the greater age on that date. Either the Purebred or Part-bred Arabians may be used and the same horse need not be used in each class. However, each horse used must be nominated with the AHCC Show Chairperson and the nomination fee paid. The Point Committee reserves the right to break down each equitation division into age groups for YEA once sufficient entries warrant.
- D. **LEADLINE:** Hunt Seat Under 7 years of age as of December 1st of the previous year. Saddle Seat and Stock Seat Under 8 years of age as of December 1st of the previous year
- E. No points will be counted for the following classes: Adult Equitation.
- F. **WALK/TROT/JOG:**

1. Under 10 years as of December 1st of the previous year.
2. Walk/Trot or Jog only. Should not canter or lope in any competition.
3. Includes all discipline classes limited to Walk/Trot/Jog Division.

G. **HUNTER PLEASURE:** All on the flat classes to count, even those flat classes in a jumping division

H. **HUNTER OVER FENCES:** Over fences classes to count (with the exception of Equitation), including those fence classes in a hunter pleasure and/or jumping division.



MISCELLANEOUS DIVISIONS

POINT AWARD CLASSIFICATION

1. MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENT

- a) Owner or lessee, rider, and handler of horse must be a current AHA affiliated member of AHCC in good standing. Owner or lessee of horses may not collect a Year End Award (YEA) if, at the time of the Awards presentation, the owner or lessee is more than 30 days past due on any money or debts owed to AHCC.
- b) Horse must be nominated in either the Regular or Regional division, and a copy of all registration papers submitted to the AHCC Points Chairperson and nomination fee paid. Points will accrue on the date of payment and for the remainder of the calendar year.
- c) Points accumulated by a horse during a show season will be transferred to a new owner provided membership requirement has been met.

2. POINT VALUES

A. Classes will count the following points:

B. In Championship or Stake Classes

D. Horses must be shown in a least two (2) approved shows in their division for performance and/or halter awards. If you ride in a class but do not pin, include on points form with zero (0) for place to fulfill two (2) show requirements.

- E. If there are not two (2) AHCC approved shows in their divisions, horses may qualify with the number of approved shows available unless stated otherwise.
- F. All points accumulated must be submitted to the Points Chairperson within thirty (30) days of the last day of the horse show. This is the responsibility of the owner or rider.
- G. Schooling Shows do not to count toward any AHCC Regular or Regional YEA

LATE POINTS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

3. DIVISIONS

A. AHA OUTSIDE OF REGION 16 DIVISION:

- 1. Points may be accumulated from any and all classes at all AHA approved shows and count towards overall high point awards, with the exception of Nationals.
- 2. Season Ends **October 31**.
- 3. Point Forms must be signed by the Show Secretary and sent to the Points Chairperson along with a copy of the show prize list within thirty (30) days of the show. **Points will not count if a prize list is not sent with points.**

B. SIDESADDLE DIVISION:

- 1. Open to both Purebred and Half-Arabian
- 2. All points will count

C. WALK/TROT/JOG 11-99 DIVISION:

- 1. Points can be accrued at any Region 16, and AHCC Regular approved show.
- 2. Open to ages 11 & over.
- 3. Walk/Trot or Jog only. Have never cantered or loped in any competition.
- 4. Includes all discipline classes limited to Walk/Trot/Jog 11-99 Division.

D. DRESSAGE DIVISION:

- 1. Points may be accumulated at any **CDA, CDCTA, and USDF** recognized competition
- 2. Point Forms must be signed by the Show Secretary and sent to the Points Chairperson along with a copy of the show prize list within thirty (30) days of the show. **Points will not count if a prize list is not sent with points.**

E. OPEN COMPETITION DIVISION:

1. Points may be accumulated at any and all open shows*, these points do not count toward overall high point awards.
*Open Shows or Classes are those in which you compete against other breeds of horses that would include classes at the AHCC approved shows where you would be competing outside the Arabian Division against other breeds of horses.
2. Classes not to count are; Equitation, Fitting & Showmanship, etc., where the rider is being judged rather than the horse
3. Season Ends October 31.
4. Point Forms must be signed by the Show Secretary and sent to the Points Chairperson along with a copy of the show prize list within thirty (30) days of the show. **Points will not count if a prize list is not sent with points.**

SPECIAL YEAR END REGIONAL AWARDS

HY-TYME REGIONAL HIGH POINT ADULT AMATEUR EXHIBITOR

1. Open to all qualified members of AHCC in good standing over 18 years of age.
2. Membership qualifications are the same as for the AHCC annual Awards requirements
3. Horse can be Purebred or Half-Arabian.
4. Horse must be shown in Halter and any Performance Division. Horse must be nominated for the AHCC Regional Year-End Awards.
5. The award will be given to the Adult Amateur that accrues the most points in Halter and any performance divisions that is offered in the AHCC Regional Year-End Award Program. Horse must qualify for Division awards.
6. The Winner keeps this trophy until December 31st and returns it to the current Banquet chairman.

The Paramor Perpetual Trophy Purebred Country Pleasure High Point Amateur

1. Open to all qualified members of AHCC in good standing over 18 years of age.
2. Membership qualifications are the same as for the AHCC annual Awards requirements
3. Horse must be shown in any Country English Pleasure Performance Division. Horse must be nominated for the AHCC Regional Year-End Awards.
4. The award will be given to the Adult Amateur that accrues the most points in any Country English Pleasure Performance Division that is offered in the AHCC Regional Year-End Award Program. Horse must qualify for Division award.
5. The Winner keeps this trophy until December 31st and returns it to the current Banquet chairman.

The Nixon Hills High Point Regional Purebred Youth

1. Open to all children under 18 year of age.
2. Must ride a Purebred Arabian
3. Membership qualifications are the same as for the AHCC annual Awards requirements
4. Horse (or Horses) must be nominated for the AHCC Regional Year-End Awards
5. Any number of Purebred Arabian horses may be used, but each horse must be nominated with the AHCC Points Chairperson and the nomination fee paid.
6. The award will be given to the child under 18 years of age that accrues the most points in all AHA recognized Purebred Arabian classes or shows (with the exception of Nationals) for a given horse show year (One Award).
7. The Winner keeps this trophy until December 31st and returns it to the current Banquet chairman.

SPECIAL AWARDS

The Board of Directors will give Special Awards at its discretion.

UNCATEGORIZED SPECIAL YEAR END AWARDS

AHCC HIGH POINT HUNTER/JUMPER

1. Open to all qualified members of AHCC in good standing over 18 years of age.
2. Membership qualifications are the same as for the AHCC annual Awards requirements
3. Horses must be nominated for the AHCC Year-End Awards
4. Can show in either Local or Regional Shows **or** both.
5. Awarded to the Purebred or Half-Arabian horse accruing the most points, in both the Hunter/Jumper divisions accrued at AHCC approved shows.
6. The Winner keeps this trophy until December 31st and returns it to the current Banquet chairman.

HT BAYFIRE MEMORIAL AWARD HIGH POINT ADULT AMATEUR EXHIBITOR

1. Open to all qualified members of AHCC in good standing over 18 years of age.
2. Membership qualifications are the same as for the AHCC annual Awards requirements
3. Must ride (2) or more horses to qualify. Horses can be Purebred or Half-Arabian.
4. Both horses must be shown in Halter and any Performance Division. Horses must be nominated for the AHCC Year-End Awards
5. Can show in either Local or Regional Shows **or** both.
6. The award will be given to the Adult Amateur that accrues the most points in Halter and any performance divisions that is offered in the AHCC Local CT Year-End Award Program. Both horses must qualify for Division award.
7. The Winner keeps this trophy until December 31st and returns it to the current Banquet chairman.

The NOSSA SEAN HIGH POINT PUREBRED SENIOR HORSE

1. Open to all qualified members of AHCC in good standing over 18 years of age.
2. Membership qualifications are the same as for the AHCC annual Awards requirements.
3. Horses must be nominated for the AHCC Year-End Awards.
4. Horse must be 20 years or older.
5. Can show in either Local or Regional Shows **or** both.
6. Awarded to the Purebred horse accruing the most points, at AHCC approved shows.
7. In case of a tie, the oldest horse will be declared the winner.
8. The Winner keeps this trophy until December 31st and returns it to the current Banquet chairman.
9. If not awarded this trophy will be returned to the Laudano family until it is awarded.

The Gildore Gagnon Memorial Trophy AHCC Good Sportsmanship

1. Open to qualified AHA Affiliated member of AHCC in good standing.
2. Recipient does not need to own an Arabian horse, or own a horse to qualify.
3. This award is awarded to the person who is dedicated to the promotion of the Arabian breed and displays sportsmanlike qualities. This award was created in honor of Gil Gagnon.
4. Nominations explaining why this person should be considered for this award must be submitted in writing to the AHCC Secretary no later than November 30th of the year prior to the Year End Awards Banquet to be held in January of the next year.
5. The Board of Directors is responsible for the awarding this award to the recipient who most meets the criteria.
6. The Winner keeps this trophy until December 31st and returns it to the current Banquet chairman.
7. This trophy is awarded when/if members have been nominated. If there are no nominations, the trophy will be presented when there are.
